These tools were developed in partnership with the British partners; contributed to the National strategy for prisoner's re-entry/ Romania. Taking part in the working group that designed the Strategy 2014-2015. Elaborated a cost-benefit analysis of this Strategy. • Legislative reform: drafting or commenting on probation legislation while working for the Ministry of Justice/ Romania, as well as during assignments for

OSCE/Albania and Helsinki Committee Netherlands/Moldova; while working for the Probation Department in Romania, contributed to the drafting and revising of different pieces of legislation, which were subsequently adopted: **Probation Law, Methodological Norms of the Probation Law, Victim Protection Law, Probation Councillor’s Status Law**; delivered short term expertise in transition countries (e.g. Albania - comments of the new **Criminal and Criminal Procedure Codes** and on the new **Probation Law**; **Moldova** - comments on the **Enforcement Code**).

- **Project management:** coordinating the activity of 32 probation services in Romania; coordinating various research projects, the current one employs five researchers and two admin support; currently - **project leader** for the IRZ/Germany for the **Croatian project “Support to further development and strengthening of the Probation Service in Croatia”** (CRO PROBATION)

- **Alternative to detention/Probation;** contributed to establishing probation system in Romania; cooperating, as short term expert, with colleagues in Armenia, Ukraine and Georgia to develop viable probation services in the region; participated in many conferences and delivered keynote speeches on probation and alternative to detention.

- **Penitentiary treatment:** worked as a prison inspector for a few years and also contributed to the development of prison programs; published a book on social work in prison; co-designed a prison program dedicated to pre-post release.

- **PR management:** benefited from training from the British company – MORI – and practiced PR strategies especially when working in the Ministry of Justice/Romania.

- **Educational management:** organized training needs assessment; design educational policies and actions plans and liaised with the universities and other training institutions.

- **Training and Teaching:** run initial and continuing training sessions; delivered courses every year at the University of Bucharest on subjects like: working with offenders, social work in prison and comparative probation; delivered training sessions in countries such as: Serbia, Montenegro, Ukraine, Kosovo or Armenia; provided training to judiciary in implementing alternative to custody and also in implementing framework decisions (National Institute of Magistracy, 2015).

- **Research:** conducting research on prison or probation issues on subjects like: who works (probation staff skills and characteristics) in probation service (2012-2014), ethnographic study of prisoner’s re-entry (on-going), foreign prisoners (2015) etc.
